### **DRAFT BEGA AND BROGO RIVERS WATER SHARING PLAN NOW ON EXHIBITION**

NSW Water Minister, Phillip Costa, today asked local farmers, industry groups and the wider community to comment on the draft Bega and Brogo Rivers water sharing plan for the area's unregulated rivers and alluvial groundwater.

Minister Costa said the draft plan provided a balance for water users and the environment.

"Unregulated rivers and alluvial groundwater aquifers are extremely valuable to the people of NSW," Mr Costa said.

"Our coastal rivers are home to some of the state's most significant ecosystems, and the bulk of our aquatic biodiversity.

"Just as importantly, they support a burgeoning coastal population, possess invaluable estuarine areas, and sustain significant irrigation industries.

"The draft Bega and Brogo Rivers water sharing plan covers the coastal catchments from the Bega River estuary and tributaries to the Upper Brogo River and Upper Bemboka, including Tanatawangalo and Candelo Creeks. The major towns of Bega and Bemboka are included in the scope of the Plan.

"The draft macro water sharing plan was developed after targeted consultation with key stakeholder groups.

"This is the next of a series of macro water sharing plans being prepared across the state for unregulated rivers and alluvial groundwater to be placed on public exhibition.

"Unregulated rivers and alluvial groundwater play an important role in providing water for the long-term security for local farming, industries, towns and the environment. If the water resources are under threat, so are they.

"Incorporating the regulated Brogo and Bega Rivers releases from Brogo Dam in the draft Plan recognises the interaction between all three potential water sources to ensure healthy river systems in the Bega and Brogo catchments.

"Once finalised, the water sharing plan will be in place for ten years, giving security and certainty for water users and the environment."

The draft Plan is on public exhibition for a period of 40 days from today until 16 November 2009.
