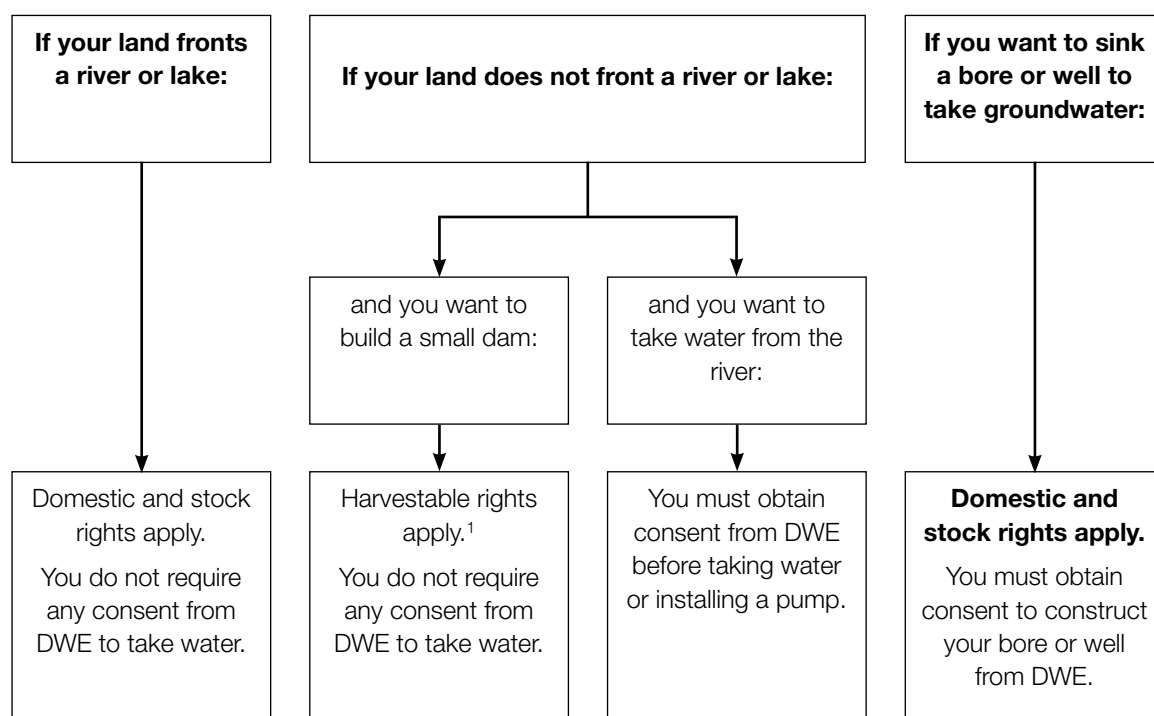




Water for my rural property - do I require a licence?

The requirement for a licence (or other approval) from the Department of Water and Energy (DWE) for obtaining water on your rural property depends on how and why you want to use the water.

For domestic and stock use of water

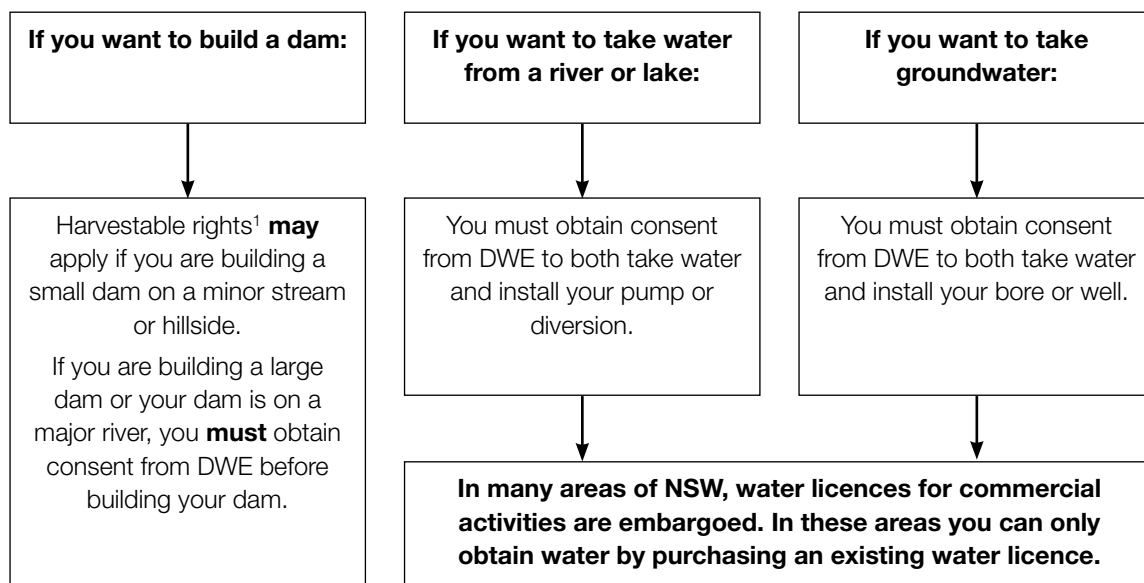


Rainwater tanks are exempt from DWE's water licensing requirements.

(Some local governments may require development consent for rainwater tanks.)

For commercial activities (eg irrigation, mining, aquaculture, feedlots, piggeries, poultry farms, golf/ sporting areas, guest accommodation, water bottling, snow making)
